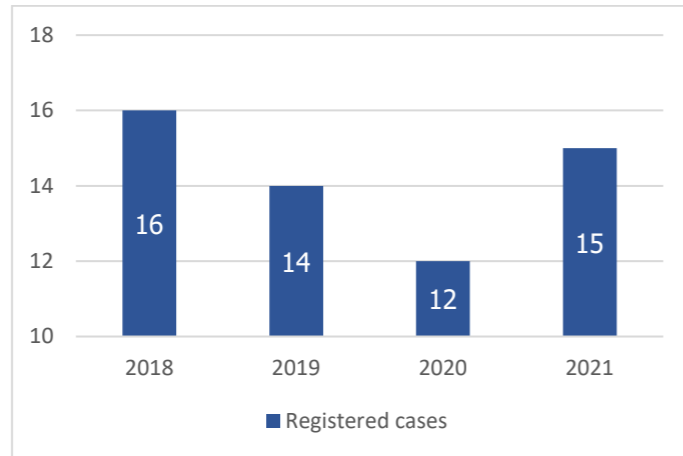

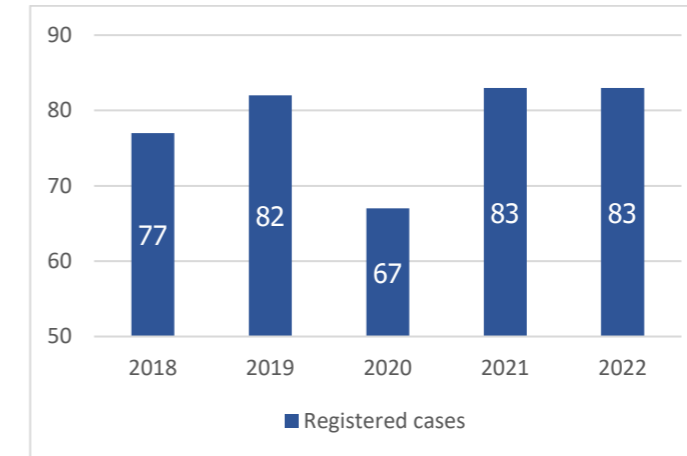

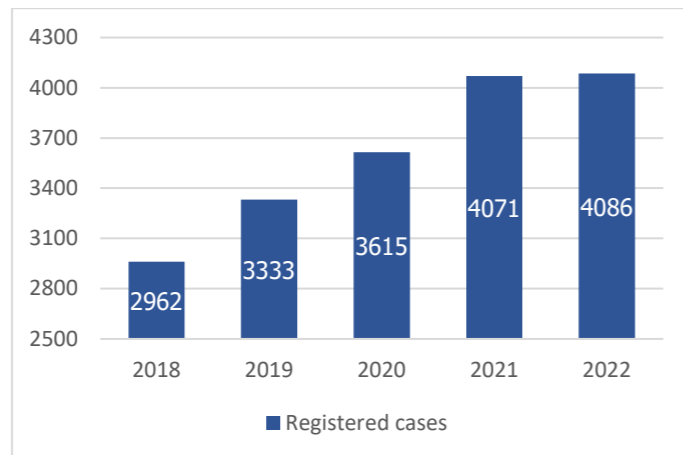

Cairo (Egypt)



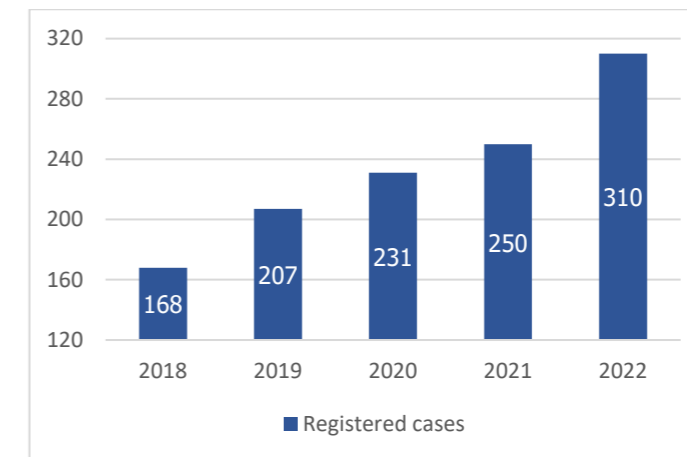

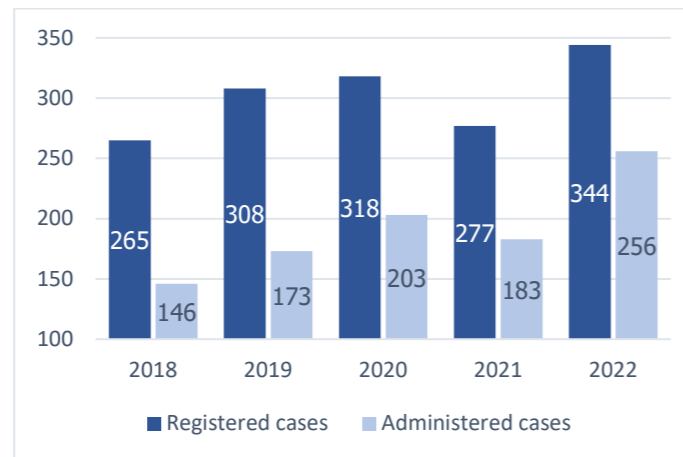

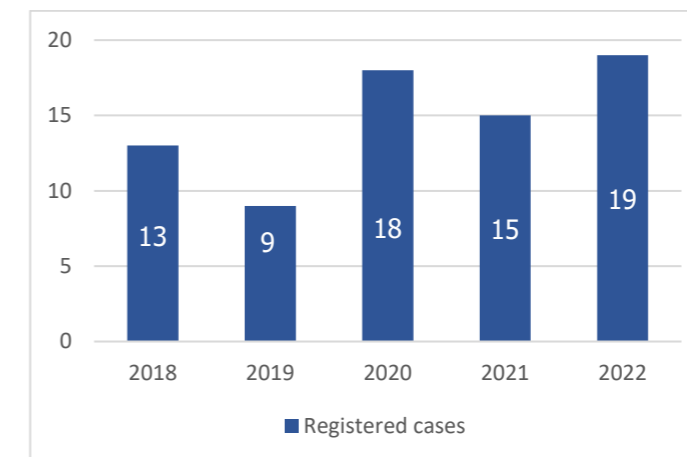

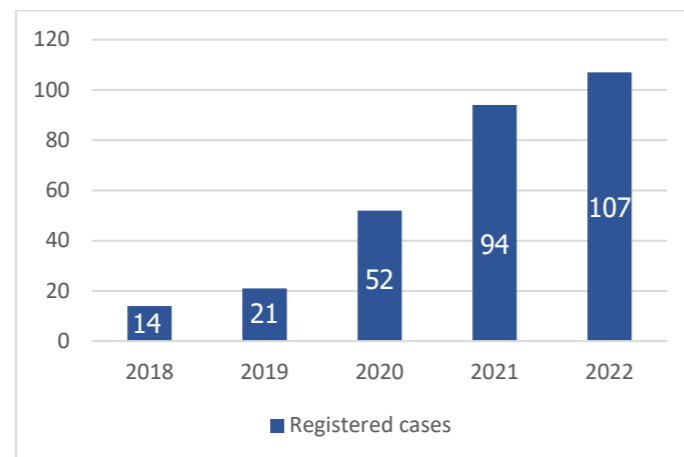

Tokyo (Japan)



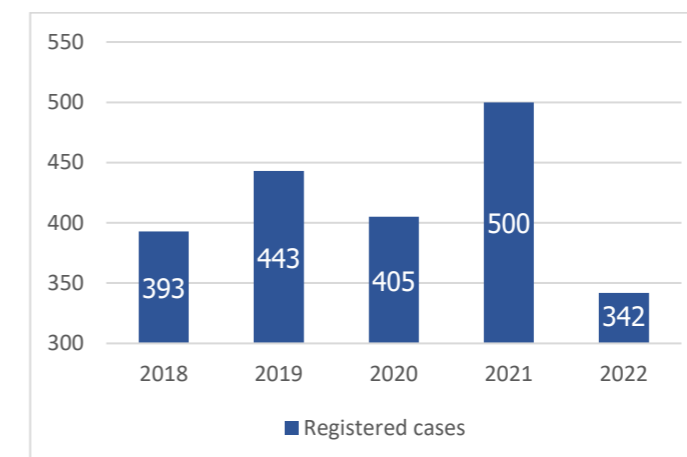

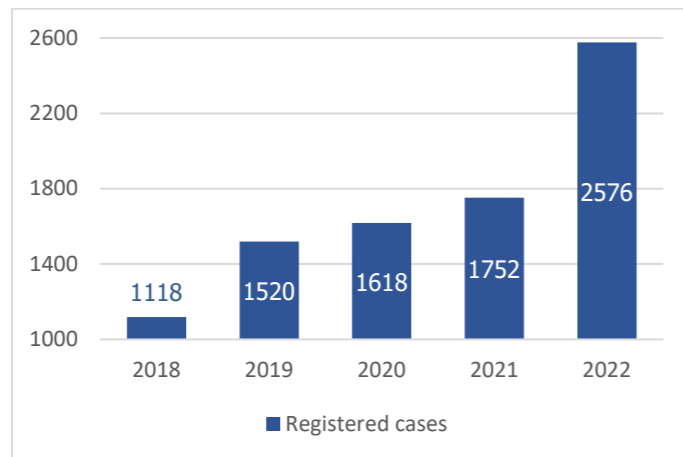

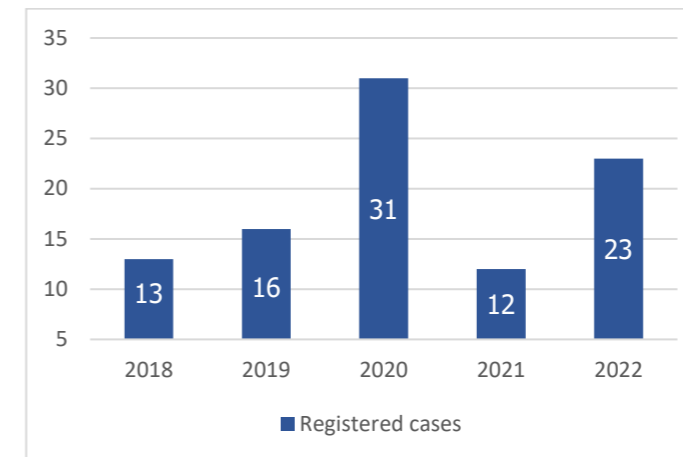
